Outcome 1 workplan that we submitted, there was already a group that was asking for support around nutrition education around corner stores YWCA has a grant to support groups with more fruit and vegetables

Sarah: is there information about nutrition

The store that is focus is Tienda Guatamalteca

We brought wic in and hopefully it will be a wic store. Owners are excited to have support and this plan. December 29th store is having an event and Angela Gross will be there to give out books.

Owners are open to any events to support community. Owners only speak spanish. Angela gross is going to work with them. They want to work with the community and make connections.

We were working with stores for a few months now and this store is really in.

Sarah will send flyer to Bethany to share with her family advocates.

Wik will provide materials for the store. There is someone coming from Diane's agency to do a cooking demonstration.

We have connections to get flyers into the community, they are thinking of coupons for \$1 off fresh produce.

Parent coalition was working hard to build a relationship with ministry with community. There is a music group starting there in January. Diane has staff there every day, partly because of housing stuff but we have grants.

Outcome 3, State doesn't mandate that we do it any certain way, we want to do it well.

Bethany, the glows and grow we could see what was happening and what needed to happen.

Bronson is excited to be working with the PF. What needs to be done to incorporate clinical staff. Bronson is working hard to bring mom and babies and protective factors together.

Outcome 4: talking is teaching, Sarah went to a training in october to get a better handle on talking is teaching planning etc.

Laura: we are thinking of doing a parent cafe in march.

We need to figure out how to use that tool in the community. We hosted a cafe last week that was awesome. 26 people with 8 dads.

Parent coalition:

Parents filled out a survey in November, they wanted to see more social time and more protective factors.

Laura: talking with teachers having a quick touch base protective factors, maybe 20 mins.

Literacy coaches work closely with galesburg elementary.

Sarah was planning on doing a taking is teaching. Start with that and say what we are doing next. Have talking is teaching as an intro. If we had the details we could let them know that a bigger event is coming.
